- Follow the State General Education Core Requirements, see Graduation Requirements section of this catalog. Follow requirements with the following stipulations: social sciences-select two courses from ANTH 2803, ECON 2803 or 2813, GEOG 2753 or GEOG 2773, PSYC 1163, SOCI 2753.
- These courses will be used to determine major GPA, see Graduation Requirements of this catalog. Student must make a C or higher in each course to meet graduation requirements of history department.
- History requirements, 21 hours: global history, six hours from the 3000, 3500, 3600, 4200, or 4300 series; European history, three hours from the 3100, 3200, or 3300 series; United States history, nine hours from the 3400 or 4100 series. One additional three-hour upper level HIST elective, consult with faculty advisor.
- Additional degree requirements, 31 hours-consult with faculty advisor. A minor of at least 18 hours is required plus 13 hours of electives. To complete 40 upper-level hours for required for graduation, students who choose to take an Intermediate I language course must take a minimum of 10 upper-level hours; students who choose an upper-level history elective must take a minimum of seven upper-level hours (see note 5 below).
- World language requirement, 8 hours. Must complete through Beginning II of a world language, and 1) take the 2303 Intermediate I Language course, OR 2) take an upper-level History elective chosen in consultation with the student’s advisor.
- Prior to graduation students must demonstrate competency in financial literacy by satisfactory completion of FIN 1521 Personal Finance Applications (or an approved substitution) with a grade of C or better, or by a score of 70% or more on a challenge exam for FIN 1521.

Student Degree Program Requirements

A student's degree program requirements are those specified in the catalog in effect at the time of declaration of program major. If not on the Guaranteed 8-semester degree plan, students may choose to meet the program requirements specified in the catalog for a later year from when they began their program of study. Students must meet the above program requirements and the graduation requirements as indicated by institutional and college policy. The program can be changed only with the approval of the official advisor. If original courses are eliminated, students may be required to meet new curriculum requirements in the degree program. If students are not enrolled for two or more consecutive terms (excluding summer terms), they must re-enter under the program requirements of the current catalog. Students are responsible for understanding program requirements and changes. Guaranteed 8-Semester Degree Completion Program Pursuant to Act 1014 of 2005, qualified first-time freshmen with a declared major may elect to participate in the guaranteed 8-semester degree completion program. Students must follow the above degree plan and meet all requirements as outlined in the Guaranteed 8-semester Degree Completion Program contract. The contract and this degree plan must be signed and filed with the advisor before the first day of classes for the student’s first term of attendance.
